Upon discharge, Firdaus will be placed under the care of the state Social Welfare Department at the Rumah Sinar Harapan Tuanku Ampuan Najihah here.

His 7-year-old brother, who is a hyperactive child, will stay at the same centre.

Rosmah said the Tabung Adik Firdaus had reached more than RM27,000, including RM9,000 from Lembaga Tabung Haji and RM1,000 each from Bakti and the prime minister.

She said the public could donate towards the fund managed by the welfare department.

Firdaus' mother, Lolanopita Sadi, was released yesterday after spending three days in jail when she failed to post bail after she was charged at the sessions court here for neglecting and leaving Firdaus unsupervised.

The court fixed July 24 for re-mention.
