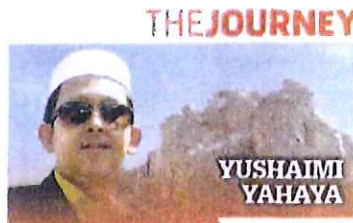
Volunteers vow to do their best for pilgrims

MECCA: About 600 volunteers and 250 assistants renewed their pledge to give their best to Malaysian pilgrims performing their haj here yesterday.

Tabung Haji haj delegation head Datuk Syed Saleh Syed Abdul Rahman said it was vital volunteers had the right commitment and intention to serve the pilgrims.

"They are Allah's guests and Allah will, God willing, reward those who serve His guests with the right intention," he said at a gathering in conjunction with National Day at the Abraj Janadriyah building here.

Syed Saleh said with eight days to



go before *wukuf*, which marks the start of the haj rites, the volunteers and assistants must fulfil their responsibilities towards the pilgrims.

He announced that the audit team had reported zero non-conformance for the Madinah operations.
