The Armed Forces has obtained an additional asset in the form of a Czech-made seven-tonne Tatra lorry, following its efficient handling of the relocation of 38,323 flood evacuees in the east coast states and Johor early this month.

Armed Forces chief Tan Sri Zulkifeli Mohd Zin said Prime Minister

Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak had given the go-ahead for the asset.

The EC725 Cougar helicopter was also used in ferrying trapped victims during the floods.

The helicopter, which had no difficulty flying in bad weather as compared to the Nuri helicopter, is also used to fly flood victims needing treatment, said Zulkifeli.

MAF has deployed 395 officers and 4.000 personnel under Ops Murni in preparation to help victims in the second wave of floods, expected to occur soon.

Among the armed forces' assets mobilised under Ops Murni are four EC725 helicopters and a Nuri helicopter owned by the Royal Malaysian Air Force; two Fennec helicopters from the Royal Malaysian Navy; two Augusta aircraft belonging to the army's air unit; 50 assault boats, 30 three-tonne vehicles and seven Tatra lorries are on stand-by in Terengganu, Pahang, Kelantan and Johor.
