## **Medical staff** to aid pilgrims

HE Lembaga Tabung Haji medical team is ready to provide medical assistance to Malaysian pilgrims performing the haj.

Tabung Haji senior general man-ager Datuk Syed Saleh Syed Abdul Rahman said 250 medical person-nel from the Health Ministry would be stationed in strategic places to give treatment to pilgrims.

He said they were prepared to look after those who suffered from heat-related illnesses, such as de-hydration and heatstroke.

The pilgrims have been advised on how to deal with extreme temperatures when they attend haj courses," he said, adding that they had been reminded to drink a lot of

water.

He was speaking after Chief Minister Datuk
Seri Idris Haron closed the state-level Per-dana Haj Course here yesterday.

Arabia could reach 50°C in the upcoming haj

season.
